Health Care Transition Guide

Health Care Transition occurs when young adults, particularly those living with epilepsy, move from receiving pediatric health care services to adult health care services. Steps for a successful transition include:

Start the conversation about transition early





Transition takes place over several years



Conversations with your epilepsy care team should *start* no later than age 12



Make sure to keep track of all conversations

Evaluate your self management skills each year with your team - It's important to track these skills every year to get ready for future responsibilities
